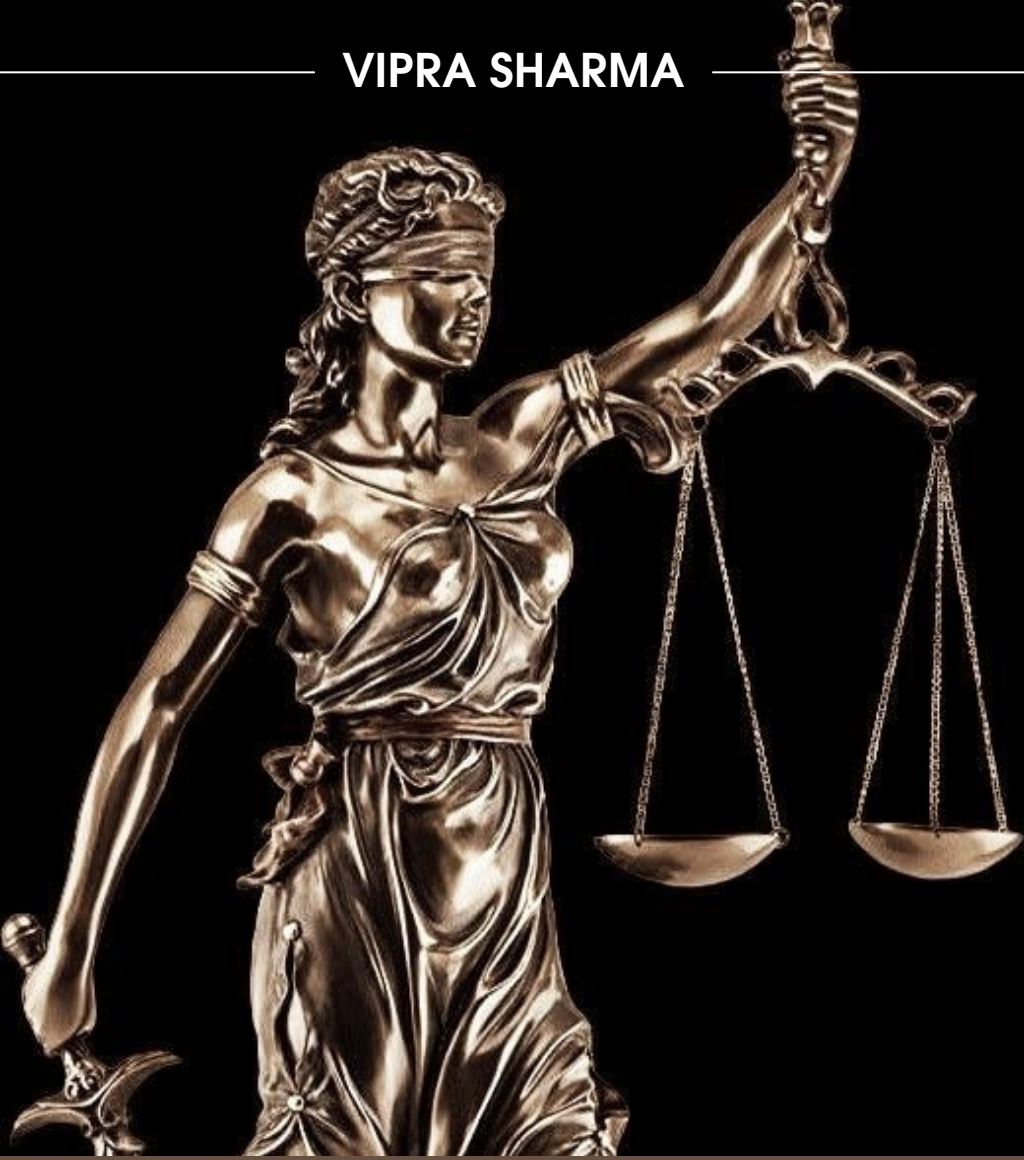

EXAM OVERVIEW AND MARKING

CUET-PG or CUET LLB earlier known as **DU-LLB** is a National-level Entrance Exam conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA) since the year 2023 for students seeking admission in the participating law universities across the country in Post-Graduation programs.

The exam is held in offline mode, with a duration of two hours. To appear for the exam, candidates must have been a graduate or appearing for the final year graduation examination in order to be eligible to appear for CUET LLB 2024. There is no specific age limit or other criteria for the exam. Although it is advisable to check with individual colleges in which they wish to apply to ensure they fulfil the eligibility requirements.

P.S.

Make sure to not leave any section of the above mentioned syllabus as every section holds equal weightage and importance. Make sure to especially revise the general aptitude and logical reasoning section and revise the maths section (generally includes area, ratios, percentage, time, number series).

PREPARATION STRATEGIES

- **Study plan** - Make a detailed study time-table for every subject afore-mentioned and go through thoroughly every day.
- **Daily News** - Read daily newspapers or online news for current affairs and general knowledge section to stay up-to-date.
- **Mock Tests** - Solve at least one Mock Test per day for help in the general knowledge and logical reasoning section as it will help in increasing speed and understanding of the questions better during the exam. You can even go through the old exams for the du-llb, which is bound to help you get an idea of how questions might be.
- **Understanding** - Try and memorise concepts by understanding their meanings instead of going for the “Ratta Marne wala Method”
- **Computer basics** - For computer basics, refer to any general knowledge book with a section for computer basics introduction and with reading

implement it practically as well for better remembering of the concepts as the test for Cuet is also in computer mode.

- **Notes** - Last but not the least, make short notes for every concept you read, use sticky notes or highlighters to mark important topics and concepts to revise everyday or once in a while before the exam. Prioritise topics which seem important and you feel like could be asked in the exam.

MOCK TESTS & PREVIOUS YEAR PAPER

Mock tests and previous year exams plays an important role in preparing for the examination. Here are some points as to why mocks help as a real-time experience before appearing for the final exam.

- **Help you to understand the exam pattern and difficulty level:** Mock tests are usually designed to simulate the actual exam. ADMIT CARD & RESULT

The admit card for CUET LLB 2024 will include key details such as exam date, timings, reporting time, exam centre name and address, and exam instructions.

Since the admit card is mandatory for appearing in the CUET LLB 2024, candidates must take a printout of it and bring it to the exam hall. If any error is found in the particulars of the admit card, candidates should contact the authorities immediately to make the necessary corrections.

Result

CUET LLB 2024 results will be available online via the exam portal. Candidates can view their scorecards by logging in with their credentials. NTA doesn't publish a merit list or conduct centralized counselling for law admissions. Candidates must apply separately to individual colleges that accept CUET LLB 2024 scores.
